

## News from Powell Police Department

All of us at Powell Police Department wish all of our seniors and their families a happy, healthy and Safe 2021. Hopefully some of the drama of 2020 with Covid, fraud and other things are behind us, but we must keep our guard up to prevent being victims !!!

Fraud is a constant throughout the year, but as we get closer to tax time in April, the fraudsters call us on our phones more often and prey upon the elderly and trustful. We have had several frauds the last few months, including the senior who was going to buy \$12,000 worth of gift cards and send them to a person he did not know. Luckily one of our local paramedics saw what was occurring, spoke to the senior and called the Police department and this fraud was stopped before the money was sent. IF ANYONE ASKS YOU TO PAY A BILL WITH A GIFT CARD IT IS A FRAUD !!!! Utility companies or any other reputable company will NOT ask for payment with gift cards. Gift cards can be turned into cash by fraudsters.

I recently worked a fraud case where there was a pop up on her computer screen from Microsoft and they wanted personal information and other account information along with a check for a certain amount. When the senior went to the bank to withdraw funds for an investment, she was advised it was a scam and she disconnected from the fraudster who had her on the phone for several hours. The fraudsters are very good at convincing others to send them money, thus the term "con man". DO NOT give anyone you do not know any personal or financial information !!

It all starts with a phone call, an email or some other type of communication. I received several calls a day from unknown numbers or other numbers that I do not recognize. If they do not leave me a message, I block the number.

Thus far we have had a pretty mild winter so the roads have been pretty good. When you are traveling or going out for a while, let someone know where you are going, give them the make/model and license plate number of your car and when you will be expected back. Bring your fully charged cell phone and dress for the cold. If something happens to you and you are not home at the designated time, law enforcement will have the information to be able to look for you. Doing this can avoid a tragedy if you happen to slide off the road and cannot be seen.

Big Brothers Big Sisters strives to ensure that all youth and mentors served in our programs experience quality mentoring relationships that uphold our legacy standards. This program provides both children and mentors with long-term positive impact.

Mentoring by an older person offers exceptional value to young people. It turns out, however, that the benefits do not stop at young people; older people benefit from mentoring as well.

Older adults participating in mentoring programs benefit from new, positive relationships with youth and children in their community. Volunteer work increases a senior's sense of purpose, which leads to greater self-esteem, often at a time in life when many older adults are depressed or isolated. By spending time with a child, an elder has a chance to transfer their knowledge, skills, and values to the next generation.

Children and youth also benefit from increased self-esteem, knowledge and skills. By spending time in a positive relationship with a senior citizen, the younger generation gains a better understanding of the process of aging. They also find older adults to be supportive role models, which leads to an all-around increase in the child's motivation to learn, along with leadership and communication skills.

Our surveys and national studies indicated that children matched with a Big at least one year are:

#### \*46% less likely to start using drugs

\*27% less likely to start drinking

\*52% less likely to skip school

\*37% less likely to skip class

### \*more confident of their performance in schoolwork

\*one-third less likely to hit someone

### \*get along better with their families
